#### **Minutes**

January 15, 2019

Mountain Laurel Quilt Guild met today because we could not meet on the first Tuesday which was January 1<sup>st</sup>.

We started with a short program by Patty Blanton showing EQ8 on her laptop projected onto a screen. This software has multiple capabilities to help us design quilts.

This was followed by the workshop portion of our meeting. Kathy Hill demonstrated the Accuquilt and encouraged us to use them during our workshop. Elmyra Morris led the workshop teaching us the Yellow Brick Road pattern. Susan Sweet brought in donation fabric for use in making donation quilts and some people brought their own fabric.

**Programs:** Patty Blanton announced that Diane Holley will provide the February program on needle punch work. March program will be by Mary Ann Caplinger, a well- known fiber artist. Patty will try to contact Bonnie Hunter for a future program.

We will have a speaker from **The Quilt Alliance**. We can become a member for \$200 and then the speaker cost is \$200. Otherwise it is \$600. If the guild joins then members can get discounted membership.

We could get a trunk show by Kaye England for \$500.It would have to be an evening and we need to find a location. This would be last of April or 1<sup>st</sup> of May. She would be likely to include educational comments as well as just showing. We could publicize and invite more people. Sew Original would offer a free space. Possibly could get library space which would be larger. We can only reserve the library a month in advance.

**Workshops:** Susan Sweet reported that February workshop will be making fidget quilts for Alzheimer patients. For this we will need buttons, zippers, ribbons, odd fabrics, snaps, sequins, lace, etc. Squares will be 8" finished.

**Business:** Susan Sweet asked for \$400 to purchase dies for the guild's GoCutter. There is a notebook with list of dies and instructions.

Susan says the challenge this year will be "Outrageous Colors". Use the colors on any project. We need to spend down some of our financial balance to satisfy IRS regulations. Kathy suggested scholarships, programs and workshops, trips, donations to local charities. Let her know if you have additional ideas.

Kathy apologized that the arrangements for the Pigeon Forge trip were not handled well. It will be better if we do it again.



We have been invited to show our quilts at the Seby Cancer Center in Boone. Susan Sweet, Chris Zimmer and Sue Stell will visit and get more details.

Mountain Threads store in Blowing Rock is starting a guild for Modern Quilt.

Sew Original will be making kits of the cuttings from AccuQuilt demonstrations so this fabric will not be wasted. They have lots of new classes coming. If you sign up for a class with a friend you both will get a 10% discount on the class fee.
