

Sue Corcoran and Patty Blanton will be explaining and demonstrating the method at the January meeting and providing more detail at the workshop. A supplies list will be provided at the meeting to anyone interested in trying this method at the workshop.

For the February Workshop, Diane Goff and Sandy Hicks will be leading a Sewing Journals class/session. You will need 2-3 coordinating fabrics (2pieces 12x 9, 4 pieces 11x8), matching thread, button and elastic for a fastener; optional: ribbon, lace, appliqués or buttons for decoration. They will have examples and additional details at the February meeting.
