Good day Mountain Laurel Quilt Guild folks,

I'm Hope Brawley the Program Support Specialist for a program called Family Connects Northwest. Family Connects is a nurse home visiting program that supports new moms, babies, and families.

We go into the homes of families with new babies around 3 weeks. We provide a wellness assessment for mom and baby, screen for postpartum anxiety and depression and help with lactation if desired. These are just a few of the services our program provides. Our program is a safety net in our community that makes sure families have the resources they need to be successful. We have been giving families a gift bag filled with goodies. We give every family 25 diapers, a book, a sleep sack swaddle, a baby blanket, and a meal. We have a phenomenal woman in our community that has been knitting baby blankets for every family, but our program has grown. We were given the name of your organization from Kelsie Summers at HOPE pregnancy center and told you might be able to help provide our program with additional baby blankets.

Our program is federally funded so it's at no cost to everyone which is amazing but the gifts we give are mostly donated by the community.

Next year we will have a donation theme per month. We can plan to have an appropriate quilt for the month. Adult and teen quilts are always needed.

Our noon luncheon and officer installation will be at Foscoe Community Center on June 7 at 11:30. It will be potluck. This location will make a shorter trip for members at Linn Haven Quilt Camp and for members who live on that side of town. Weather permitting we will be able to eat outside. Shop News:

Sew Original: Patty Blanton showed an embroidered flower block and described the Aurifil pack of the month club. Each month you get the pattern and thread to make it. A Martelli representative will be in the store on 3/11 demonstrating tools. Patty will be teaching a thread painting portraits class. Next Saturday 3/12 the Quilt Club Block of the Month begins at 9:00. **Workshops:** March workshop Diane Goff and Sandy Hicks will demonstrate making small journal books which can then hold needles, pins, scissors etc for travel. The guild will provide fabric and embellishments. Also that day we will be sewing together the squares from our bunny bingo game. Patty Blanton showed us how to make a star block with any left over $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " squares and some neutral fabric. Cut the background and center squares 1" bigger than colored squares. Or just come for the fellowship and sew whatever.

April Workshop will be by Katherine of Mountain Threads store and was arranged by Betty Minick. We will learn how to make small bowls of coiled rope and fabric. Katherine will also do the April program. Sign up for the workshop at the April program.

Susan Sweet showed us the Round Robin quilt. It has grown to be almost large enough and very beautiful. Becky Kennedy will take it this month. We played Bunny Bingo led by Susan Sweet. We had made our playing cards of colored fabrics and designs. Susan called the colors and designs and we placed our buttons. Susan had acquired and saved an amazing collection of stuffed bunnies and those were the prizes.

Patty Blanton showed two donation quilts – a dinosaur and alligator design and a Windy Days quilt.

Lois Stewart showed a cute Bunny Rabbit baby quilt using paper piecing and applique.

We unloaded twenty-seven boxes of new fabrics in the last couple of weeks, most of it celebrating new fabric lines (and filling in some blank spots in the old fabrics). I have to confess that we now carry cat fabric, the infamous No Ordinary Cats. Northcott's Lavender Market is here, many new aboriginal prints, and all my backorder Moda have arrived. And due in shortly is Soar Naturescapes from Northcott and the fun summer prints of Capri from Art Gallery – a little bit of something for everyone.
