We have been in touch with Dr. Beavers office and he is most appreciative of our pit pillows. He has a second Quilt Guild that also provides them pit and port pillows. Beth, one of the receptionist made a request that I need to check out. She is asking if our sewers can make cotton chemise for surgery patients. It's like a lightweight Tshirt but has Velcro opening, sleeveless and two front pockets to hold Jackson Pratt drains and tubes following surgery. Seams can be zigzag or serged for those with sergers. Next month I will have instructions and hopefully one completed. This is not an obligatory donation project and I realize its not quilting, but some of us enjoy other creative outlets, so I am sharing.

June workshop will be making baby quilts.

President Chris Zimmer announced names of those running for office and called for nominations from the floor.

Program

Lois Stewart presented the program on how she uses pantographs to quilt her own quilts on her own domestic sewing machine. She buys pantographs either at Sew Original or online or finds them in magazines. The online purchases come in a PDF file which you print. You then make copies and tape them together and tape the resulting large pattern to your table. Trace the design onto your backing fabric. For this you need fabric you can see through well enough to trace the design. Put the guilt sandwich together and quilt following the traced lines on the backing. Use the bobbin thread as the top thread. Keep in mind any directional design such as words will be reversed on the top of quilt. She uses Frixion ball pens to trace. She has not had any trouble removing the marks but you might want to test on your fabric. For the workshop Lois will bring some pantographs. You bring 1-2 frixion pens, backing fabric, batting, thread, gloves, basting pins, sewing machine with free motion or walking foot.

Donation Quilts:

Amy Stewart showed her "unblock" blocks. Each is a response to a prompt. This series of prompts was about a place. First the region and Amy made a block to represent the Blue Ridge.

Next prompt was the lay of the property. She made a block representing her plot of ground and used gray netting to represent the fog. She made it into a bag. Next was a block showing a favorite thing about the place. Next was a block of a door. It doesn't have to be an exact replica of a particular door. Last was a block that she calls paper play using geometric pieces.

Lee Ann Williams showed a donation toddler quilt.

Patty Blanton showed her embroidery on rope bowls. She will be instructing methods for this on 5/25 in the afternoon.

Pat Carson showed a journal she made based on our sewing kits workshop.

July Workshop: "A Modern Slant on A Vintage Apron"


Some members may remember the program that Lee Ann Williams did on the April 2021 Zoom Meeting. The program featured a Vintage Apron that would be a lovely Hostess Apron. The apron is by "The Sweet Tea Girls" - a company from Clayton, NC. Started by a retired IBM

Engineer, the Instructions (not patterns) are meticulous. The designs are symmetrical and balanced Eclectic Styles.

The Apron has a gored skirt design. It was inspired by a Vintage Apron found at an Antique Shop in the Hill Country of Texas. The apron requires 4 - 5 fat quarters OR 1 &1/4 yards of fabric. Bring Fabric/ thread/ scissors/ ruler/ sewing machine.

The Vintage Apron makes a lovely gift. You will want to make them in various seasonal color combinations.
