## Shop News

#### **High Country Quilts:**

As it snows outside, three things always happen at High Country Quilts: spring cleaning and rearranging the shop to make room for new collections; new classes postings to the website; and starting a new Mystery Quilt (finally).

New Maywood, Moda and Art Gallery collections are on the shelves, while we make room for Java batiks and Stof moderns. To do this we have added to our Yarbies (four, 1-yard cuts of fabrics for \$19.95) introducing 3Bies – three yards of Northcott solids for \$15. These are great for borders and background fabrics.

To start the new Mystery Quilt, come by the shop to enroll, receive instructions and material requirements, and get your first clue. After that, you'll just need to email a photo of your finished step to receive the next step via e-mail. As always, you can use our fabrics or your stash fabrics for this project.

Posted classes include:

Orion's Star - Updated techniques are added to an old favorite. Focus is on how to port these techniques to other quilt projects.

Machine Embroidery – A series of four classes of what you need to start embroidering with a machine. If you have a machine with an embroidery unit that has gone un(der) used or are contemplated purchasing an embroidery capable machine, this class is the place to start.

FinishUp Friday – A sit and sew on steroids, get help with those PhDs (Projects half Done).

As Cath is back in the classroom, regular days are Monday, Wednesday afternoon, and Friday through February. In March, Wednesday afternoon and Thursday will be added back to the schedule. If you need a weekend visit, let us know and we'll try and work around shop classes.

#### **High Country Quilts-**

If you haven't tried Art Gallery Fabrics (AGF), you need to check out this fresh line of super high quality cottons with an extra high thread count – 200+. We have almost 400 bolts of prints and solids, and are slowly adding canvas, linens, rayons, denim, and knits to our store stash. The March shop special is AGF Fat Quarter samplers, bundles of FQs in color waves and collections of bold prints. And AGF always has the best collection of free patterns to inspire you. #### **Reminders:**

The Mystery Quilt Tour restarts in March with Iron Mountain Flowers, inspired by the Martha's Flowers stoneware pattern from Iron Mountain Stoneware, once located in Laurel Bloomery – sort of. Pick of mystery quilt program instructions, fabric requirements (you can use your stash fabrics), and Clue 1 – the cutting instructions at the shop. Suggested size if a large throw, but if requested we will customize for queen bed quilt.

Need fabric for your guild charity quilts, we have special curated collections – including patriotic and gentlemen themed groups – of four 1 yard cuts for \$10. Let us know when you come in and we will make these available. Please let us know the guild and the group slated to receive your finished project.


The mystery starts in earnest on Black Friday, the day after our Thanksgiving day here in the USA.


