High Country Quilts; Regular days in the shop are turning out to be Monday and Friday – as this is when most of you are requesting when we are open. If you are interested in Dona manning the shop while Cath heads to Newfoundland to have Cabot and Gracie blessed this summer please let us know in advance – we are looking at scheduling Monday openings in August and early September if interest is there.

Summer is perfect for kits – a project ready to work on. Dona has built some gorgeous kits in both traditional and modern patterns. Threebies (3 yard solid bundles) continue at \$15 and Yarbies (4 – 1 yard cuts of curated fabrics) continue at \$19.95 while supplies last. And since the shelves are starting to get skinny there is new fabric on its way – with no plans to exceed current prices – with vendors' help and smart shopping.

We have two upcoming classes – exact class dates are TBA at this writing as we are working Sugar Grove classes around <u>family</u> health issues. Both take advantage of some of the Down Under fabrics we have in the shop. The first is a table centre / table placemats class that features Moda new Wovens and Towelings from Janelle Kent planned for late June. The July class features Aboriginal fabrics and wall quilt from the Australian Spirit Book – the publishers have given me permission to turn photographs into to

patterns. We will gladly kit either project or you can stop by the shop, select your colors, or bring fabrics from your stash fabrics to work into a kit. Check the website for updates and
