I hope summer's end finds you able to spend some quality time with your families. Mine went something like this:

Ransom, my 7.9 year old grandson was spending those last few afternoons with me while his mom got caught up on things at her office. I could tell he was feeling a bit bored, being in that few days left of summer vacation phase. We were in my workroom when he sat down at my sewing machine and said, "Nana, I want to sew." "OK, let me get some needles and you can pick out some fabric," I replied thinking he wanted to do some hand sewing. "No, I want to sew with your machine," he said.

"Oh, OK,"I answered not knowing exactly how this was going to turn out. Then my mind immediately flew back decades ago when my grandmother sat me down at her foot pedal Singer, showed me how to begin, and trusted me to my own devices. She always had a project ready for me when I would visit and was patient as she encouraged me to learn by doing new projects. It seemed to hold his focus and allowed him to concentrate in a way I had not noticed before. If only I had that much confidence when I sit down to machine quilt! He came back the next day and wanted to do more. I showed him how to clean and oil the machine knowing that he would be interested in that. We talked about what we could do with the pieces he had created and decided to make a small blanket for the animal shelter. He took one of his mug rugs to his new teacher at his school's meet and greet. I feel so very blessed that I was able to share these moments with him. I hope the same for you as you share your talents with family and friends.
