Show and Share:

Sue Corcoran – Sewed a pocket to pink donation quilt & added a doll.

Diane Ward- Made a T-shirt quilt with gray background and pinks, blues, & purple hues Susan Payne - Made a Kaffe Fassett fabric quilt using half square scrappy triangles in a diamond shaped pattern and a lap size pineapple quilt Elmyra Morris – made a disappearing 9- patch with 6" squares from the workshop, a 48" youth size donation.

Beth Reavis – made a ministry wall hanging quilt and a donation quilt from Men's shirt fabric in a heart-

shaped design. Shared her grandson's free motioned quilt sandwiches.

Chris Zimmer – Showed a Shaw quilt with pocket for use in a wheelchair, maybe for Foley Center Betty Minick – Made rag dolls from previous Workshop.

Sandy Livingston – made donation dolls.

Guest Speaker:

Our September program guest speaker was Cindy Stuart from Maryville, TN. She is a certified quilt appraiser for the state of TN. She said she mostly appraised antique quilts from the 50's back. In the Victorian era 1880's, quilter's sometimes put a spider on their quilt for good luck. One reason to have your quilts appraised is for insurance purposes. Quilt values have gone down in part because of the increase in minimalists.

Factors considered in appraisal are name of maker, when made, overall condition, holes, stains, fading, wear on binding, reconstruction cost, amount you paid, secondary patterns or visual appeal, embellishments. If possible, the appraiser looks at the back side as well. The appraiser may take photos and find comparable sales from auctions and from various quilt organizations, for example, the American Quilt Society.

Appraisal of art and modern quilts are harder to value, the process involves value from other similar quilts and comparable from patterns of other art quilters. They are in a separate category from traditional quilts. A source for appraisal art quilt information might be The American Quilt Museum in Puducah, KY.

Sue Sweet brought her beautiful crazy quilt that she purchased to have appraised. Sara Pedroni brought a quilt to show that was handed down by family with small prints and a design that radiated out from the center of the quilt.

To become a certified appraiser requires application, and both oral and written examination, and to continue appraising, they must recertify every 3 years. Cindy Stuart's phone is 865-386-0940. Cindy gave information on how to care for quilts including: Don't fold the quilt in the center. Refold about every 6 months.

Keep out of direct sunlight & humidity.

Store in acid free tissue storage chests, can be bought from MSQC for \$21 or may cost as much as \$35. Wrap tissue around the quilt, then line with old cotton sheets. Low vacuum old quilts to get the dirt off. Washing takes years off an old quilt's life. Remember to sew labels on the back of your quilts using white cotton fabric to tell their story, writing with fabric markers is best.

Nov 3 - Strippy Fold Over Bags


